ORDERING PROCESS

To access the IDIQ, USAID Missions or Washington Bureaus may submit a draft Task Order (TO) Scope of Work (SOW) that falls under the IDIQ's overall Scope of Work to the USAID Contracting Officer Representative (COR) for review. Once approved, the Task Order Contracting Officer (TOCO) and IDIQ COR will develop a procurement timeline and issue a Request for Task Order Proposal (RFTOP) from the pre-qualified prime contractors. The TOCO will subsequently be responsible for final selection, negotiation, and award of a TO.

The IDIQ facilitates a streamlined procurement process and offers a straightforward price structure with an established fixed fee ceiling for Cost Plus Fixed Fee (CPFF) contracts while also providing for Firm-Fixed Price (FFP) structures.

The procurement process established allows for expedient and flexible issuance of task orders to meet the development challenges and programmatic needs of USAID Missions and Bureaus in complex and often rapidly evolving environments.
